

MA VICTORIAN STUDIES

(Revised programme from 2011/12 entry)

Duration: 12 months minimum full-time / 2-3 years part-time

Total credit rating: 180

Entry requirements

Applicants should normally have achieved the following prior to registration for the programme:

A good honours degree or an equivalent combination of formal qualification and professional experience (such as Diploma of Education plus teaching experience). Where the academic qualification did not include a substantial element of study of relevance to the Victorian period, applicants are required to demonstrate knowledge of, and commitment to, the interdisciplinary study of the Victorian period.

Previous relevant learning will be assessed and, where appropriate, accredited as part of the application process. Please see the College's Assessment of Prior Learning (APL) procedures.

Progression, Classification and award requirements

To be eligible for the award of MA, candidates must attempt and achieve 180 credits, which must include VICM 1103 *The Victorians* and VICM 1113 *Approaches and Methods for Victorian Studies*, and either VICM 3013 *Report* or VICM 3016 *Dissertation*.

All students failing VICM 1103 must resit and pass the module before proceeding to their second year. Full-time students failing VICM 1103 will therefore be required to change to part-time mode.

Candidates who fail a module twice will not normally be permitted to proceed on the MA programme but may be allowed to work towards a Postgraduate Diploma.

To be eligible for the award of the Postgraduate Diploma candidates must accumulate 120 credits, including 60 credits from the core modules.

To be eligible for a Postgraduate Certificate, candidates must accumulate 60 credits, including 30 credits from one of the core modules.
