Progression and Award

On entering the MA/PGDip programme, a student will be required to register directly for the PGDip.

Students may opt to proceed to the MA on successful completion of the PG Dip and follow one of two routes – JOU 7146 *Applied Journalism Research Project* or JOU 7186 *Research Methods and Dissertation* (each worth 60 credits).

Award of Master of Arts (MA)

To be eligible for the award of MA in Journalism candidates must accumulate a total of 180 credits.

Award of Postgraduate Diploma

To be eligible for the award of the Postgraduate Diploma Candidates must accumulate a total of 120 credits.

Progression to JOU 7091 *Professional Placement* is dependent upon a satisfactory recommendation arising from designated tutor-based appraisals carried out during JOU 7063 *Live Production*.

Students must pass JOU 7173 *News Skills* and JOU 7063 *Live Production* to be eligible to enrol on JOU 7146 *Applied Journalism Research Project*.

Successful completion of the PG Diploma is required for progression to the MA module.
